

... thoughts from our Artistic Director

Our concert tonight is a celebration of the joy and pleasure music brings to our lives! The music selections have been carefully crafted so that you may accompany us on a magical musical journey!

Concert Orchestra will open our program by featuring their cello section with Latin Rhythms; depict danger and intrigue on a sailing vessel from three centuries ago with a majestic captain's theme, the crew dancing on the deck to a jig and a skirmish with pirates!

Chamber Orchestra will tantalize your ears with far-eastern harmonies on a visit to Singapore, the "Lion City" with shimmering glissandos and special sound effects to imitate authentic instruments such as the ehru, pipa and the gamelan. Heading back home to the "New World," the wonderful folk songs of our homeland will welcome us back home and finally entertain us with a rousing tribute to John Williams with "Music of the Cinema" sweeping us melodically away to other galaxies!

Symphony Orchestra will end our musical travels on the waters surrounding the Hebrides islands with music written to depict the stunning "Fingal's Cave." Located seven miles off the Scottish coast, these purple-black rock columns create a landscape cathedral which, as Keats wrote, "For solemnity and grandeur, it far surpasses the finest cathedral." Mendelssohn lays down melodic swirls of water supporting harmonies of majestic grandeur echoing brilliantly from the walls of the caves massive depth of seventy-six yards deep and sixty-six yards high.

Schubert Symphony No. 1 Movement 1 will whisk us away to Austria where a young Franz, age 16, would compose his very 1st symphony. Nearing the end of his education in Vienna he studied composition with the famed Antonio Salieri, Mozart's biggest nemesis. Schubert captures our heart as he became a school teacher and an advocate for youth, composing his vast array of works when school was not in session.

Our musical journey will end in the Czech Republic where "The Bartered Bride" was premiered. The Opera, set in a country village and with realistic characters, tells the age old story of how true love prevails over the combined efforts of ambitious parents and a scheming Marriage Broker! The Dance of the Comedians is a lively and humorous display showing the grand arrival of a troupe of traveling carnival performers into the town square where the peasants are also dancing in anticipation of their arrival! The composer, Bedřich Smetana......"was the first to give Czech music its characteristic stamp, its own distinctive expression and to bring to life its typical rhythm and pulsation. This is the great artistic achievement which earned for Smetana the everlasting love, respect and gratitude of his nation." (Frantisek Bartos)

Cindy H. Petty Artistic Director/Conductor Symphony Orchestra

Cindy H. Petty is a conductor and teacher recognized for her "outstanding precision, musical vision, motivation, engaging stage presence and a unique ability to connect with musicians and audiences of all ages". As a Conductor, Cindy currently serves as Orchestra Director at Benjamin Franklin Charter High School (AZ), Director and Conductor of the Oregon Arts Orchestra (OR), Associate director of the Women's Orchestra of Arizona: Holiday Concerts Conductor with Music Nova Orchestra (AZ); Principal Guest Conductor and Guest Concertmaster for the Sapporo Philharmonic Orchestra (Japan), and Conductor Emeritus of the Jewish Community Orchestra (OR).

As a violinist, she currently performs with the Newport Symphony (OR), Music Nova Orchestra (AZ) and the Chandler Symphony Orchestra (AZ). In addition, Cindy has 10 years experience producing festivals concerts and worldwide for Music Celebrations International (AZ) including festivals in Italy, Austria, Czech Republic, Germany, France, Spain, Portugal, New York City in Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., Orchestra Hall in Chicago and Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles.

Ms. Petty is sought after as a clinician and adjudicator for State and National Music Festivals, All-State Orchestras and Youth Honor Orchestras nationwide. In 2007, she was knighted by the Royal Rosarians of Oregon, under the banner of the rose "Artistry" for her extensive contributions to the community through music.

Previously Ms. Petty has served as Music Director and Conductor of the Portland Youth Philharmonic Conservatory Orchestra; Oregon Pro Arte Chamber Orchestra; Oregon Pro Arte Youth Chamber Orchestra: Pro Arte Conservatory Strings; Granite, Jordan and Lincoln Youth Symphonies; the Portland Ensign Choir and Orchestra and the Portland Adventist String Orchestra. She has been honored to be the guest conductor for the Coachella Valley Symphony Orchestra. Rose City Chamber Orchestra, Newport Symphony, 15 All-States Orchestras, 25 Regional Honor Orchestras, and multiple other orchestras throughout the United States, Canada, Japan and Europe with performances in Kitara (Japan), Dvořák Hall (Czech Republic), Haydnshall (Austria), The Kennedy Center (Washington D.C.), Walt Disney Concert Hall (CA), and Orchestra Hall (Chicago) among others.

CONDUCTORS & MUSICAL SPECIALISTS

Priscilla Benitez Conductor Chamber Orchestra

Priscilla Benitez is an Arizona native who grew up attending Tempe schools. She received her degree in Music Performance from Arizona State University (ASU) where she served as concertmaster of the Symphony Orchestra and the Lyric Opera Theater Orchestra. After graduation from ASU, she began working for several orchestras including the Arizona Opera Orchestra, Musica Nova, and the Sun City Symphony (now the West Symphony). While living in Sweden, she also played with the Norrkoping Symphony.

Upon her return to Arizona, Mrs. Benitez began teaching for the Tempe Elementary School District. She taught 4th and 5th graders for 8 years and then worked 13 years as Director of Orchestras at Connolly Middle School where she consistently had 25–30% of the students in the school participating her orchestra program. She was a Tempe District Impact Award winner in 2010–2011 for excellence in teaching and the winner of the Outstanding Mentor Teacher Award in 2017 given by the ASU School of Music for her work with ASU student teachers and interns.

Among the highlights of her time teaching at Connolly were the annual 8th grade trip to Disneyland where her students recorded segments of the background music from Disney animated movies in the Disneyland recording studio. Another highlight was each year's final concert where the orchestra students joined their band colleagues to form a full orchestra. She retired from the Tempe Elementary District in May of 2020,



but didn't stay completely retired for long as she took a part-time position in August of 2021 teaching elementary students in the Mesa Public School District. She also continues to maintain an active private studio where she has taught hundreds more students over the years.

Mrs. Benitez also performs in many local orchestras, in backup orchestras for national tours, in musical theater pits, and with the Allegro Quartet. She has played in the pit for the Arizona Opera and many musical theater companies including Phoenix Theater. Arizona Broadway Theater, Valley Youth Theater, Musical Theater of Arizona, and Broadway at the Orpheum. She has also played in back up orchestras for tours of such groups as Mannheim Steamroller, The Eagles, The Moody Blues, Smokey Robinson, Olivia Newton-John, Dionne Warwick, Sarah Brightman, Game of Thrones, Il Divo, and many others.

Mrs. Benitez has been married to her husband, Jim, a professional trumpet player, for 43 years. They met in a youth orchestra when both were in high school. Their family consists of 8 adult children, all of whom were involved in music when they were high school students. Two of those children currently teach orchestra in two of the high schools in the Gilbert School District. 12 grandchildren have joined the family so far. Spending time with her family is her favorite leisure time activity.


